

# **Camp Order No. 1**

## **Subject: Commander's Intent for 2012**

By the authority vested in me as Commander of the General George Wright Camp 22, by the Department Bylaws, the National Constitution and Regulations, and National Policies, it is hereby ordered as follows:

Section 1: To further the growth and success of General George Wright Camp 22 and the SUVCW, recruitment of new members will continue as a major priority. All members are encouraged to participate in recruitment events, support the planning and organization of such events, and to feel free to provide input and ideas to enhance recruiting efforts

Section 2: To establish and maintain a more prominent public presence, the Camp will participate in a number of special events in the community. All members are encouraged to participate to the extent possible, and to be supportive of events by any other means if direct participation is not possible. Such events may include Free Museum Day in Historic Old Sacramento, Sacramento Gold Rush Days, Living History events at Alcatraz and other locations, Gibson Ranch and other re-enactment events. It is the intent of the Commander to determine which of the myriad of events are to the mutual interest and agreement of Camp members, and to focus heavily on those key events.

Section 3: To further preserve the memory of the Grand Army of the Republic and our ancestors who fought to preserve the Union, the Camp will attempt to affiliate with a local school and provide some educational support in the teaching of Civil War history. The Camp will also participate in planning and performance of a Memorial Day ceremony at the Sheldon Cemetery.

Section 4: To maintain morale and good order of members, there will be several special meetings throughout the year. The location and content of these meetings will be determined by the mutual agreement of Camp members. Suggested meetings may include: special tour of the Aerospace Museum of California or the California Railroad Museum, live firing of weapons, Honor Guard drills, a family dinner or barbecue, or any other locations or topics as suggested by Camp members. Special meetings may be in place of or addition to regular meetings, as agreed by Camp members.

The foregoing Camp Order is proclaimed this 4<sup>th</sup> of January in the year of our Lord two thousand twelve, and of the independence of the United States of America the two hundred thirty-sixth, in the City of Folsom, County of Sacramento, State of California by Jon C. Henry, Commander of the General George Wright Camp 22, Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War.
